### **Turning up the Warmth on Your Leadership Thermostat**

"Leaders, when was the last time you made your staff feel genuinely welcomed and valued?

Remember, you are the thermostat." I happen to see this statement on Linked In and it caused me

to reflect on the importance of leaders to be the thermostat that sets the temperature for their team and to ensure the thermometer doesn't get too hot or too cold within the workplace. Examples of ways that leaders can set the temperature within the workplace are having a welcoming personality, being approachable, seeking input, being willing to listen, showing empathy, being respectful, etc. As leaders, your ability to set the tone and foster a culture of inclusion and appreciation directly impacts the morale and effectiveness of your teams.



Reflect on the last time you intentionally made your staff feel welcomed and valued. Did you express genuine gratitude for their contributions? Did you take time to celebrate their successes, both big and small? Consider how your daily interactions—whether through a thoughtful note, a verbal acknowledgment, or simply listening attentively—serve as a thermostat, setting the climate of positivity and belonging in your school or department. Remember, when staff feel seen and valued, they are more likely to bring their best selves to the important work they do every day.
